At Lindsey House, we consider our "clients" our family. The overarching goal is to help single mothers change the future for themselves and their children. Lindsey House provides the safe place, structure, curriculum, accountability and encouragement, but the mothers are the ones putting in the hard work.

No one is more grateful for that hard work than the children living at Lindsey House - who get to focus on being kids. There's Jeremiah, who at 10 years old was named Student of the Month for the first time this uear. Jace and JJ who, for the first time ever as 6th and 7th graders, attended the same school two years in a row thanks to the stability they are now experiencing. Linkin learned to ride his bike in the parking lot here, and Sage and Alayna conquered the monkey bars on the Lindsey House playground. Cheyenne and Dominic reunited with their mom here, leaving foster care behind for good.

Lindsey House changes lives. Moms are increasing their wages and phasing out of dependence on government sponsored programs. Kids are leaving the foster care system, and have better attendance and performance at school because of their stability here. Together, we are empowering families and breaking generational cycles of poverty, addiction, incarceration and abuse.





OUTCOMES



7 families successfully completed our three areas of curriculum, graduated and transitioned to housing of their own in 2022.



Current participants collectively have more than **\$60,000** in savings. In addition, they've paid off thousands of dollars in debt.



In 2022, 11 children were working through trial reunification with the goal of their mom regaining full custody and exiting foster care.



We provide a clean, sober living environment. Current participants with a history of substance abuse collectively have 35 years of sobriety.



13 women started new jobs earning higher wages with a more stable schedule. Of those who graduated, 100% are currently employed.



Demand remains strong. Throughout 2022, 364 mothers completed a pre-screen, the first step in our application process.

When Nechole came to Lindsey House in September of 2021, almost everything about her life was in disarray. She had trouble holding a job, her apartment was perpetually chaotic, and she rarely saw her older child. For the first few months, this struggle continued.

And then it clicked. Nechole made a decision to enroll in an intensive 8-week training program for Data Analytics. She continued to struggle with the demands of being a mom, working part-time and staying on track with her training course, but she persevered.

In November of 2022, Nechole completed her training course! This was a big accomplishment for a number of reasons:

- She now has an entirely new career path with better wage and scheduling opportunities
- Her children witnessed what it looks like for their mom to work hard
- Nechole proved to herself that she could accomplish her own goal!



Nechole is on the right path towards self-sufficiency., She's learned how to better keep her living space clean and organized, she's ready for a career (not just a job), and she's able to be a better mom to both of her children.

Lindsey House is proud of Nechole, and the 23 other moms who are working hard every single day to change what their future looks like for their family.
